- The vaccine is free of charge across the UAE, with over 120 centres in Dubai providing the COVID-19 vaccine. A valid Emirates ID is required to show eligibility

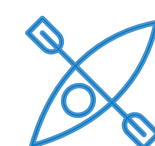

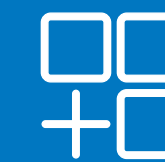

TRAVEL UPDATE



WHAT ARE THE INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS WHEN TRAVELLING TO DUBAI?

- All tourists and residents arriving into Dubai from any point of origin (including GCC countries) must hold a negative PCR test certificate, for which the test must be taken no more than 72 hours prior to the time of departure.
- As announced on 22 April 2021, travellers from certain countries must hold a negative PCR test, taken no more than 48 hours prior to the time of departure. Please see the following links for a list of countries which this is now applicable for:

- Negative COVID-19 certificates must be printed in English or Arabic (the date and time of the test must be detailed) , PCR certificates in other languages are acceptable if they can be validated at the originating station. The printed certificate must have a valid QR code. No hand written, SMS or digital certificates will be accepted.
- UAE nationals are exempt from the above, but will be required to take a PCR test on arrival at Dubai airport. Unless the country of origin requires a pre-travel test.
- Tourists may test at any lab accredited by their health authority in their country. If you are travelling with Emirates Airline, please see the following link for a list of accredited labs <https://c.ekstatic.net/ecl/documents/health-screening-documents/approved-laboratories.pdf>
- If travelling from selected destinations detailed in the following link, residents and tourists must take two COVID-19 PCR tests: one before departure and a second test upon arrival in Dubai <https://www.emirates.com/ae/english/help/covid-19/dubai-travel-requirements/tourists/>
- If you take a test at the airport, you must remain in your hotel or residence until you receive the test result.
- Travellers are advised to check the carrier requirements.
- Ensure you have medical travel insurance with international coverage that covers COVID-19 before travelling.
- Customers purchasing an Emirates Airline or FlyDubai ticket from 1 December 2020 benefit from additional multi-risk travel insurance provided by AIG Travel, including cover for COVID-19 and overseas medical expenses. Please see the following links for more information and a supporting FAQ:

ARE TRANSIT TRAVELLERS REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE SAME PROCEDURES RELATED TO CONDUCTING COVID-19 PCR TESTS?

- Passengers from certain countries transiting through Dubai must conduct a PCR test before departure, please refer to the following link for further details: <https://www.emirates.com/ae/english/help/covid-19/dubai-travel-requirements/tourists/>
- Tourists may test at any lab accredited by their health authority in their country. If you are travelling with Emirates Airline, please see the following link for a list of accredited labs <https://c.ekstatic.net/ecl/documents/health-screening-documents/approved-laboratories.pdf>
- Negative COVID-19 certificates must be printed in English or Arabic (the date and time of the test must be detailed). The printed certificate must have a valid QR code. No hand written, SMS or digital certificates will be accepted.
- Please check your country's travel advisory for latest guidance on outbound trips, as well as your carrier requirements.
- All passengers will have their temperature taken with thermal screening devices.



DO TOURISTS HAVE TO PAY FOR THE TREATMENT AND QUARANTINE STAY IN A HOTEL?

- The traveller will bear the cost of treatment and quarantine.
- Customers purchasing an Emirates Airline or FlyDubai ticket from 1 December 2020 benefit from additional multi-risk travel insurance provided by AIG Travel, including cover for COVID-19 and overseas medical expenses. Please see the following links for more information and a supporting FAQ:

- Alternatives for isolation include institutional quarantine (dedicated hotels/facilities), home or hospitalisation and potential options based on the patient's assessment. The 10-day isolation period will be completed while following all necessary precautionary measure and monitoring of symptoms.
- The duration of quarantine for COVID-19 has been reduced from 14 days to 10 days with effect from 5 January 2021.
- A person who is infected with COVID-19 will remain in isolation (home or institutional). The isolation period for a confirmed COVID-19 case is 10 days. The isolation ends after completing the 10 days with improvement in symptoms and no fever for 3 consecutive days at least, without any fever reduction medication.

DO I HAVE TO WEAR A FACE MASK DURING MY HOLIDAY IN DUBAI?

- Face masks are compulsory, as is keeping a two-meter social distance.
- You must wear a face mask unless exercising, eating or drinking, in a car with your family or driving alone.



WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW OR WHAT ARE RULES I HAVE TO FOLLOW WHEN IN DUBAI?

- Responsibilities of travellers:
 - Adhere to all official measures and requirements established by the Dubai Government and other countries before travelling and after returning to Dubai.
 - Disclose any symptoms before travelling by filling in the form provided by airlines.
 - Tourists will bear the costs of examination and treatment abroad, in the event they are infected with COVID-19, so are advised to have international health insurance coverage before travelling. Unless travelling with Emirates or FlyDubai who will both cover their customers for COVID-19 medical and quarantine expenses when they travel to and from the UAE and around the world free of charge.  - Take precautionary measures and self-monitor for any symptoms of COVID-19.

- Travellers are advised to check their country's travel advisory for latest guidance on return trips to check the testing requirements.



IF TRAVELLERS HAVE TAKEN THE VACCINE DO THEY STILL NEED TO COMPLY WITH PCR TESTS WHEN FLYING TO DUBAI?

- Yes, travellers must still comply to PCR testing protocol.
- Please check your country of origin and arrival destination travel guidelines, as well as the carrier requirements.

WHAT ARE THE PROCEDURES FOR EXITING DUBAI AIRPORTS?

- Tourists are required to download the COVID-19 DXB app - <https://apps.apple.com/app/covid19-dxb-smart-app/id1504818399>
- Tourists who show symptoms on arrival and test positive for COVID-19 after being re-tested must comply with a 10-day quarantine.
- The duration of quarantine for COVID-19 has been reduced from 14 days to 10 days with effect from 5 January 2021.
- A person who is infected with COVID-19 will remain in isolation (home or facility). The isolation period for a confirmed COVID-19 case is 10 days. The isolation ends after completing the 10 days with improvement in symptoms and no fever for 3 consecutive days at least, without any fever reduction medication.
